Fraser is the Co-Founder of and Principal at AlphaBeta in Singapore. Fraser is passionate about using economics to help address major societal challenges, with a particular focus on sustainability, the future of work, and accelerating economic development. At AlphaBeta, he has led work with organisations including Temasek, the World Economic Forum, the ASEAN Secretariat, the Asian Development Bank, and various investors and businesses on topics including accelerating action on the Sustainable Development Goals, addressing plastic waste, rethinking food systems, supporting the energy transition, creating circular economy models, and establishing smart and sustainable cities. Fraser is also Co-Founder and Chief Strategy Officer of Sun Cable, which is creating the world's largest solar PV project (based in Australia's Northern Territory) with an undersea cable providing renewable energy to Southeast Asia.

Prior to AlphaBeta, Fraser spent 9 years at McKinsey & Company, working with a range of governments and leading corporates in the Middle East, Africa, Europe, the United States, and in Indonesia. Before McKinsey, he worked as a consultant at the World Bank and the Boston Consulting Group, and was also a lecturer of economics at Oxford University. He received a Doctorate and Masters in Economics from the University of Oxford, where he studied as a Rhodes Scholar. Fraser also served as the inaugural President of the Australian Chamber of Commerce in ASEAN, launched by the Australian Prime Minister in 2017.
